Across the Township, Public Works is leading infrastructure projects, including road paving and the Boot Road sewer main replacement, coordinated with PennDOT’s bridge project. These upgrades strengthen essential systems and prepare West Whiteland for the future.

Behind the scenes, our Administration and Finance teams ensure the Township runs smoothly, maintaining balanced budgets, supporting services, and successfully retaining West Whiteland’s AAA bond rating—a reflection of strong fiscal management and community trust.

We continue to focus on upgrading aging infrastructure, managing growth responsibly, and protecting community character. Redevelopment projects are carefully reviewed to align with residents’ priorities and maintain a balanced, sustainable Township.

Our Police and Codes teams remain committed to keeping neighborhoods safe and vibrant. As we prepare the 2026 budget, we are focused on investing your tax dollars wisely in infrastructure, public safety, and sustainability. Public meetings continue through December, and we encourage your input.

## Boot Road Park House New Station Location for EMS

Good Fellowship Ambulance has moved into Boot Road Park House as an additional EMS station location within the Township. The new location will provide space for ambulance crews to park, restock supplies, complete reports, and have a comfortable place to rest and prepare while remaining ready for emergencies. Parking accommodations for ambulances are also being added at the house, which will help reduce response times to areas throughout West Whiteland Township.

This change is designed to enhance the safety and wellbeing of every resident and business in the community. With the transition to a new EMS station, **Boot Road Park House will no longer be available for rentals.** The annual Egg Hunt will continue at Boot Road Park, and the playground, baseball fields, and restrooms will remain open for public use.

Residents are encouraged to say hello and meet Good Fellowship’s EMS providers when visiting the park.

# Trash and Recycling Fees to Increase in 2026

For homeowners whose trash and recycling is collected by the Township’s contracted hauler, the annual fee has been \$89 since 2021. That fee includes weekly curbside collection of recycling and one bulk item and monthly yard waste pick-up. There is also a pay-as-you-throw fee of \$2.50 per trash bag for items that cannot be recycled.

The \$89 annual fee goes into the Township’s solid waste fund and is not collected as a general tax. The trash and recycling system is financed and operated like a private business enterprise, with the costs of providing the service recovered through user charges.

Over the past two years, expenses have exceeded revenues, making a fee increase necessary to maintain a balanced solid waste fund. **Beginning in 2026, the Township’s base annual fee will increase by \$134, bringing the total to \$223 per household.** When factoring in the cost of one trash bag per week,

**the average household will spend approximately \$353 per year.** Even with this adjustment, West Whiteland Township will continue to have one of the lowest solid waste fees in the region.

As reported in the Spring/Summer newsletter, the Township awarded a new contract with **AJ Blosenski** for weekly curbside trash and recycling, effective January 1, 2026. The previous contract from 2020 included two optional one-year renewals, allowing the Township

to avoid passing on cost increases for several years.

To ensure the best pricing for residents, the Township issued bids for trash and recycling services twice—once in the summer of 2024 and again in spring 2025. AJ Blosenski submitted the only viable bid and was awarded the contract. The new contract comes at a **42% higher** cost, reflecting rising expenses in labor, fuel, and disposal fees.

The cost increase will be incorporated into the **2026 Township budget**. Staff is also researching the viability of bringing trash and recycling collection in-house rather than contracting with an outside vendor. Updates will be provided via eNews, social media, and the Township website as more information becomes available.

# Good Fellowship Subscriptions for Ambulance Service

Good Fellowship Ambulance (GFAC) is the designated Emergency Medical Services provider for the Township. Crews are ready around the clock, 24 hours a day and 7 days a week, responding to more than 9,200 emergency calls each year and providing prehospital care to both residents and visitors.



Ambulance transport can bring significant costs. With an annual subscription to GFAC, subscribers have no out-of-pocket expenses if treated and/or transported by our team. A subscription not only protects you from unexpected bills, it also helps sustain our mission: providing lifesaving care to anyone in need throughout the greater West Chester and Exton service area.

## Charting Our Future

### Updating the West Whiteland Township Comprehensive Plan

West Whiteland Township is planning for the future – and you’ve helped shape it! Throughout 2025, West Whiteland Township has been working with the Chester County Planning Commission to update our Comprehensive Plan, the long-range guide that sets the vision for how West Whiteland will grow, develop, and thrive in the years ahead.

Community input has been at the heart of the process. Nearly 2,000 residents shared their voices through our public survey — thank you to everyone who took the time to weigh in! We also hosted two public open houses this year, the most recent of which was held on October 29, 2025 where residents reviewed and discussed draft recommendations for the future of our community.

The adoption process for the plan is expected to take place early next year, when the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors meet to discuss the draft plan and hold additional public comment periods. ## New Billing System for Sewer and Solid Waste Payments

Final bills for 2025 were sent to Township residents for sewer and solid waste (trash and recycling) services in October. **Payment is due December 31, 2025.**

To pay or check your balance:

Unpaid fees after December 31 will go to Portnoff, the Township’s designated collection agency.

### Bills in 2026

The bills for 2026 service will be sent in April. You can choose to pay the full amount when you receive your bill or in installments up until December 31.

The Township will be transitioning to a new payment service in 2026, so the online payment site will look different. Watch for a separate mailing with instructions on how to sign up.

Please remove all decorations and do NOT wrap the tree in plastic or another covering. Also, trees should be cut into pieces no longer than 4 feet. (For instance, if you have an 8-foot tree, please cut it in half to make two 4-foot "trees.")

## Reduce Holiday Waste – Celebrate Sustainably!

Check out these extra earth-friendly tips during this busy time of year.

- Minimize shipping orders; consolidate items when ordering or shop local.
- Consider reusable gift packaging like gift bags.
- Check your wrapping paper before you buy. Can it be recycled?
- Regular and glossy wrapping paper is recyclable unless it has non-paper additives like metallic flakes, glitter and plastics.
- Be mindful of food waste and make efforts to reduce it.
- Donate lightly used/unused Christmas decorations to re-use stores.

Place **leaves** in biodegradable brown paper bags. All other materials and debris, or leaves in other types of bags or containers, will not be collected.

Gather **branches** and tie with string, not wire, in small bundles that can be easily handled. Collection is limited to branches that are a maximum of **4-feet long** and **4 inches in diameter**. Small twigs should be placed in a rigid container.

Due to heavy loads some months, the hauler may not be able to collect all leaves and branches on the collection day. In this case, the hauler has asked that you **leave the materials at the curb, and they will be collected the following day.**

## Check Your Trees

Please check the health of the trees on your property, paying special attention to the ones that are near streets or public roadways and above walkways. It is the property owner's responsibility to maintain these trees or have them removed, even if it is a state or Township road that they overhang. **If a branch or tree falls and injures someone or damages property, the property owner can be held liable.**



If Township staff sees or is notified of a dead tree on private property that is in danger of falling on a public street or sidewalk, the Township will notify the property owner to have the tree removed within a given time period as a matter of public safety. Neglecting to remove the tree may result in penalties as stipulated in the adopted Township

Codes and Ordinances. On a private note, please be aware that insurance companies typically will not pay for damages incurred by a fallen dead tree or cover the insured if this tree was known to be dead and has been neglected and/or not removed by the rightful owner in a timely manner.

The Township clears fallen branches or

trees that fall on Township roads and cuts back overhanging branches that can cause damage to vehicles or block the sight line. **Please keep your trees and shrubbery trimmed to allow vehicles – including snow plows – to pass.**

## Recycle Your Holiday Lights

Holiday light strands don't belong in your curbside recycling bin, but you don't have to throw them away either. The Township began collecting these lights last year, and the community responded with lots and lots of lights! We will repeat the collection this year, providing bins in the Township building vestibules.

The vestibule facing Commerce Drive is open during normal business hours (Monday – Friday, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.), and the vestibule facing the parking lot is accessible 24/7. As the bins fill up, staff will deliver the lights to Harris Metals in Coatesville.

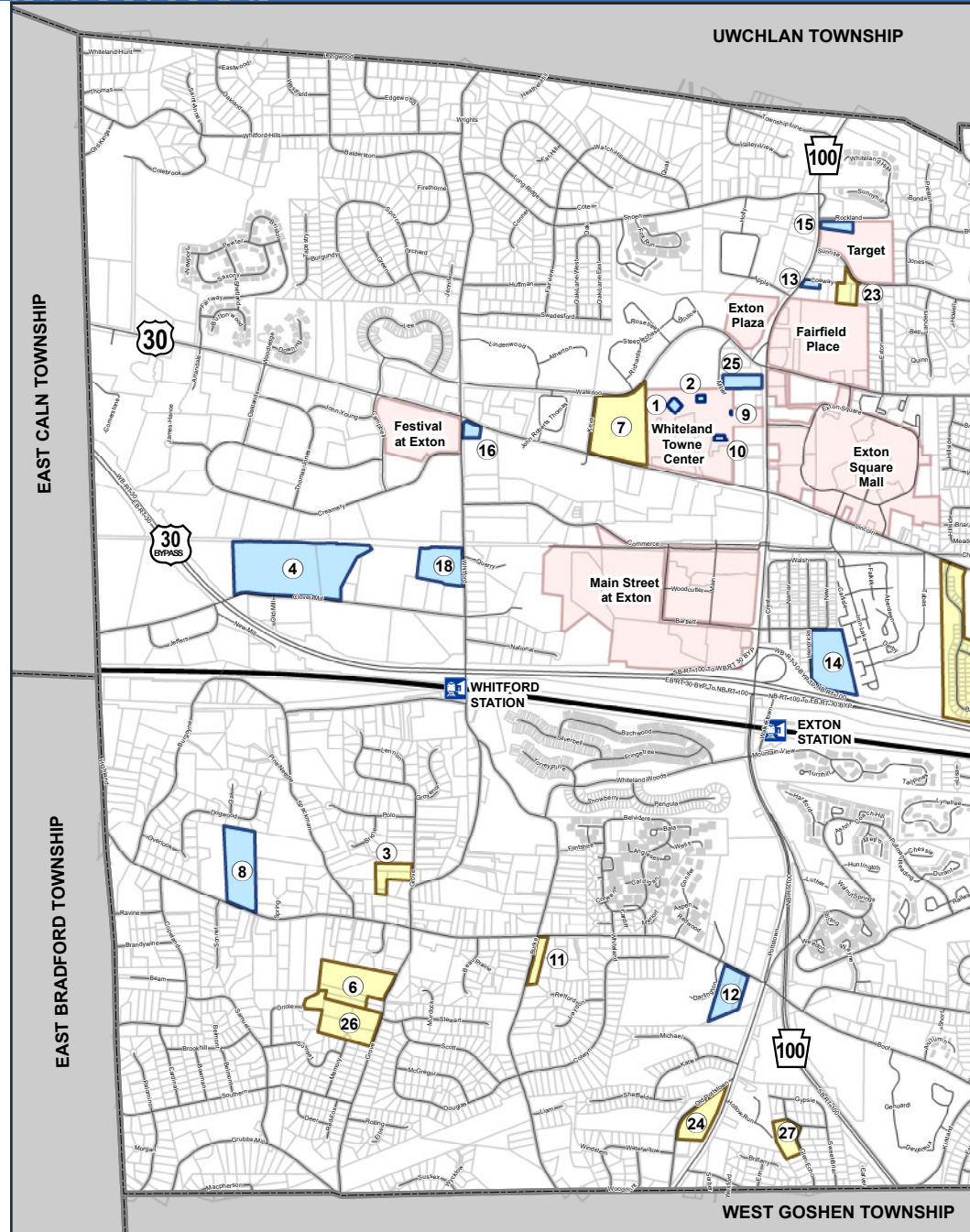

- 5 **Exton Walk Singles (NVR Homes):** 95 single-family homes on the southern portion of the Laborer's Training facility along Lincoln Hwy.

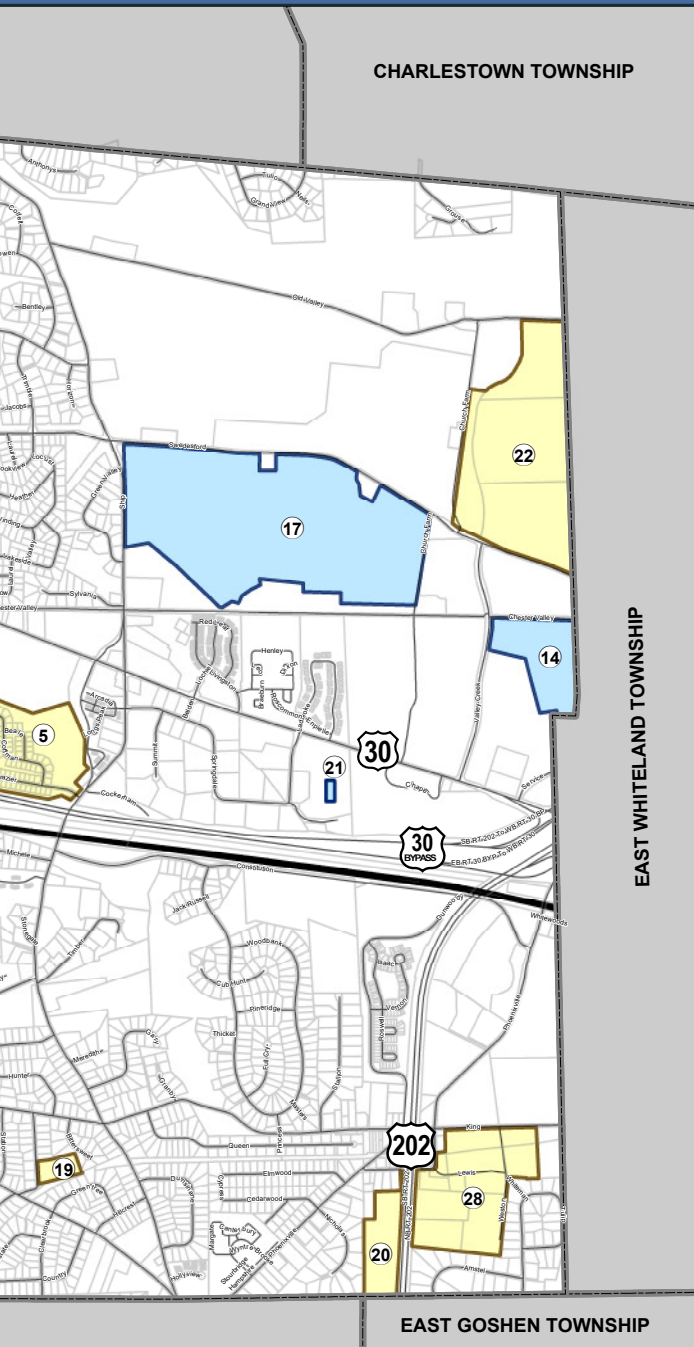

# Rental Properties

*All owners of rental properties in the Township must register with the Township's Codes Department.*

**Property owners must register current tenants and apply for a residential rental inspection 10 days prior to a new tenant occupying the rental unit.**

- \$100 for townhome or single family
- \$75 for multi-units
- Receive a Certificate of Occupancy after passing the inspection.

- Smoke detectors located on each level and in each sleeping room
- Fire sprinkler system is not obstructed and is turned on

## How to Register

- Complete a Rental Inspection Application for either single-unit properties or multi-unit properties (apartment complexes or other single properties with multiple rental spaces) online [www.westwhiteland.org/511/Inspections](http://www.westwhiteland.org/511/Inspections) and click "Inspections – Residential Rental Properties".
- The Codes Department will email you to arrange an inspection and provide payment instructions.

## Landlord Responsibilities

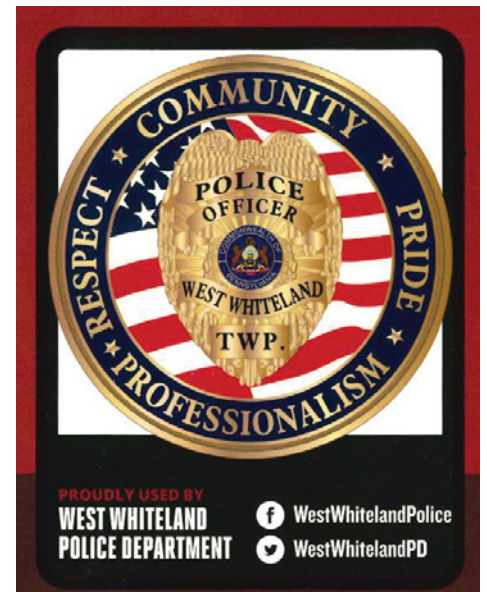
A complete list of inspection requirements is available in the Township's ordinances, accessible from our website; a partial list is included below. Codes officials perform inspections for the safety of all; opportunity will be given to make repairs and request a re-inspection.

- Weathertight roof, doors, and windows
- Walkways, steps, and handrails present where necessary
- Plumbing and electrical systems in good working order

# New Park Signage

# Fire Safety Tips

## Portable Heaters

Place space heaters on a solid, flat surface. Keep them at least three feet from things that can burn.

Check your space heater for cracked or damaged cords and plugs. Plug space heaters directly into wall outlets, don't use an extension cord or power strip.

## Decorating for the Holidays

The holidays are a time for warmth, light, and celebration — and also a time to stay fire-smart! The West Whiteland Township Codes Team reminds residents to keep safety in mind when decorating and heating your home this season.

- Keep candles at least 12 inches away from anything that burns. Make sure they are in stable holders and place them where they cannot be knocked down easily.
- Read manufacturer's instructions for the maximum number of light strands to connect.
- Get rid of your tree after Christmas or when it is dry.
- Consider using battery-operated flameless candles, which can look, smell, and feel like real candles.
- Water your Christmas tree every day. A dry Christmas tree can burn very hot and very fast.
- Inspect holiday lights each year before you put them up. Dispose of light strands with frayed or pinched wires.
- Make sure your tree is at least 3 feet away from heat sources like fireplaces, radiators, space heaters, candles or heat vents. Also, make sure your tree does not block exits.



## Use holiday lighting safely.

Dispose of light strands with frayed or pinched wires. Turn off all your holiday lights before going to bed or leaving your home.



# Snow Removal – Keep Our Streets Safe This Winter

As we prepare for another winter season, please remember these rules and tips for keeping our streets safe and free of snow:

- When a snow event is predicted, park cars in your driveway or garage rather than on the streets. Also remove any sports equipment, such as basketball nets or hockey goals, from the street.
- Clear the snow from the sidewalk adjacent to your property, as well as any snow around a fire hydrant.
- Deposit snow on your own property. Avoid piling snow in the gutter, on the stormwater inlet, or in the street. Make sure your snow piles do not block the sight distance to any roads.
- To save yourself extra work, wait until streets are completely plowed before you clean your driveway.

Township ordinance requires that **snow be removed from public walkways and fire hydrants within 24 hours of when the last snow or ice has fallen.**

Ordinance also allows the Township to tow or remove any vehicles or other obstacles on the street two hours after the start of any continuous snowfall until the snow has been completely plowed from the street.
