

Creating jobs and new opportunities for Pennsylvania’s skilled workers

In March, Energy Transfer and the Philadelphia Building Trades, the umbrella organization for more than 50 member local unions that work in the Greater Philadelphia region, signed a project labor agreement (PLA) for the Marcus Hook Industrial Complex in Delaware County as part of its commitment to Pennsylvania.

The agreement, valued at an estimated \$200 million, covers all Energy Transfer on-site growth construction projects planned for the next two years, with options for extensions. It is expected to employ up to 1,200 skilled labor tradesmen at the natural gas liquids hub on the banks of the Delaware River. Among the trades to benefit from the PLA are electricians, steamfitters, boilermakers, ironworkers, operating engineers, sheet metal workers and plumbers.

#Committed2PA: We're making a difference in communities

will go directly toward that," program director Ashley Wilmont said at the check presentation. "In addition, part of this funding will go toward logistics for the Trout Release Day field trip this spring, during which students learn about the environmental aspects of the program out in the field."

The environmental education program connects students in grades K-12 with their local watersheds. The students learn about the life cycle of Pennsylvania native species brook trout by raising trout from eggs to fry, monitoring tank water quality, engaging in stream habitat study, learning to appreciate water resources, fostering a conservation ethic and growing to understand ecosystems.
